JUAN CARLOS NARVAEZ (Age 58) MD Dr. Juan Carlos Narváez, 58, of Aflington, VA, passed away Friday, September 29, 2023, surrounded by his loved ones, at Inova Fairfax Hospital. Juan was born in Mexico City DF, in Mexico, to Dr. Julio Narváez and Dr. Elsa Rodríguez on July 13, 1965. He attended high school at Shenandoah Valley Academy, in Virginia, graduating on April 17, 1983. After graduation, he went to Southern Adventist University, in Tennessee, where he graduated Magna Cum Laude with a BA degree in Chemistry, on May 3, 1987.

Following graduation, Júan studied medicine at Loma Linda School of Medicine, in California, graduating in May of 1991, and then completed an Internal Medicine internship in 1992. Juan had a Health Professions Scholarships Program military scholarships After his internship, Juan earned the rank of Lieutenant and Naval Flight Surgeon at the Naval Aerospace Medical Institute, in Pensacola, Florida, in February 4, 1993. He then served the rest of his active duty time in Corpus Christi Naval Air Station. Following his military service, he finished a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation residency at

Loma Linda School of Medicine from 1995 to 1998. In June 1999, Juan completed a Pain Fellowship at the Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital, an affiliate of Harvard Medical School. During the years of 1999 to 2002 he joined the Army, working as a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Doctor at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, and on June 29, 2005 he continued his military career by joining the Air Force Reserve until he retired with the rank of Colonel, on April 1, 2018. In 2007 he completed a fellowship in Vascular and Interventional Radiology, at the Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School, in 2008 a fellowship in Cross Sectional Body Imaging at the Johns Hopkins Hospital, and in 2012 a fellowship in Musculoskeletal Radiology at Thomas Jefferson University.

In July 2012 Juan started working at the Alexander T Augusta Military Medical Center at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, and he continued

working there until his passing.

Juan enjoyed traveling and living life to the fullest. He visited many countries, embraced adventures, including conquering Mount Kilimanjaro, in December 2019. He was witty, funny, intelligent and caring. He will always be remembered by his kindness, unselfishness, the many friends that he kept connected with through his lifetime and still the many others he embraced until his passing.

Juan is preceded in death by his mother Dr. Elsa Rodríguez. He is survived by his father, Dr. Julio Narváez, Jenny Oms, siblings Julio, Yamila, Nelson, Julio C, Sybelle Narváez, as well as 6 nephews and 6 nieces. A private memorial was held with family and friends, at his home in Alexandria, Virginia on September 30, 2023.
